

SPRING MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

LANDSCAPING:	ROOF:
 □ Wait until after the last frost to plant seedlings. □ Remove dead plants. □ Check trees for weak branches and have them removed. □ Check the concrete for new cracks and have them filled. □ Tune-up any lawnmowers, etc. □ Fill in any holes with fill dirt & re-seed. □ Make sure water drains away from the house, and build up the grade if necessary. □ Does your deck need to be re-sealed? 	 □ Clean gutters and downspouts. □ Secure gutters and downspouts. □ Check for worn or damaged shingles. □ Check flashings for rust/cracking. □ Check for water damage under the roof. □ Clear away any trees/branches touching the roof.
	ELECTRICAL:
	 □ Replace bulbs in outdoor light sockets. □ Have your system checked if your fuses trip constantly, or if you experience flickering/dimming. □ Install GFCI outlets near any water source, and in all exterior outlets.
☐ Check crawl spaces for standing water,	PLUMBING:
 ventilation, or animal inhabitants. Check basement for any leaking or cracks, if any are larger than 3/16", consult an expert for repairs. Inspect walls for 'weep holes' and repair any that are leaking. Condo residents - consult your by-laws regarding basement repairs before hiring a contractor. 	☐ Check the garden hose for leaks. ☐ Test your water supply. ☐ Test the sump pump. ☐ Fix leaky valves/sinks. ☐ Have your septic tank tested and pumped out (if you have one). HVAC:
FRAMING/EXTERIOR:	☐ Uncover the air conditioner.☐ Have your furnace checked & cleaned.
Look for signs of infestation. Look for sagging headers or tilting walls. Does your brickwork need mortar repointing? Does the siding or trim need repainting? Secure loose siding and trim. Replace cracked or broken windows. Caulk around doors, windows, and vents. Replace storm windows with screens.	 □ Check your ductwork for cracks, seal any spaces with foil tape. □ Install/test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and replace any old batteries. □ Have your cooling system checked out. □ Ensure your air conditioner is clean, free of debris, and elevated on a concrete pad or other solution.

* Many of these repairs you can complete on your own, but for any taks that you are unsure of - feel free to consult a home repair book or hire a professional contractor.
